# Heads up! Social Security Is Changing Notice Policy, Affecting People Who Are Blind or Visually Impaired

AARP recently released an article that there is now a new opt-in process for those who are visually impaired or blind to continue receiving mailed notices from the Social Security Administration in formats such as large print and braille. The article states that many of the hundreds of thousands of Americans with vision loss who receive specially formatted notices from the Social Security Administration (SSA) will stop getting them this summer unless they act now to continue this service.

Starting Aug. 14, Americans who are blind or visually impaired will *only* receive the online version of SSA messages unless you or someone assisting you logs in to your account and "opts in" for paper mailings. If you do that, you will continue receiving special notices in your preferred format along with online notices in the Message Center of your My Social Security account.

#### **How to Keep Your Special Notice Option**

According to the AARP article, "if you're a Social Security beneficiary with vision loss, you can take these steps to keep your special notice option intact:

- 1. Log in to your My Social Security account.
- 2. Go to Preferences and click on the button to edit Communication Preferences.

3. Set your communication preference to "Send a paper copy and an online copy."

#### **How to Set Up Special Notices**

The article also included the following steps for Setting up special notices: "If you do not get special notices and want to start, log in to your My Social Security account and open the Preferences page. Click the Request a Special Notice Option link in the blue information box at the bottom of the page and choose one of these communication methods:

- Standard print notice by first-class mail
- Standard print notice by certified mail
- Standard print notice by first-class mail, with a follow-up phone call
- · Standard print and braille notices by first-class mail
- Standard print and large-print (18-point font) notices by first-class mail
- Standard print notice and Microsoft Word file of text on a data CD, by first-class mail
- Standard print notice and voice recording of the text on audio CD, by first-class mail"

## August Is Children's Eye Health and Safety Awareness Month

According to Consumer Health Digest:

"About 80% of what children learn in school is taught visually, which means if a child has an undetected or uncorrected vision problem, it will affect the child's development and performances in school." They list the following as possible warning signs that your child may be experiencing vision problems:

- Tilting the head or squinting to see the class board better or when watching TV
- Frequent eye rubbing when he or she is trying to concentrate on something.
- Holding a book too close to their eyes or often sitting close to the TV.
- Consistently using his fingers to guide his eyes when reading.
- Closing one eye to read or watch TV.
- Excessive tearing without any tear-causing stimuli.
- Eye discomfort when using a computer or any digital device, i.e., digital eye strain.
- Sensitivity to light, sometimes accompanied by headache or nausea.
- Wandering eyes.


